#### <u>Kindergarten and First Grade:</u>

#### Don't leave home without it

Bring along a book or magazine any time your child has to wait, such as at a doctor's office. Always try to fit in reading!

#### <u>Play word games</u>

Have your child sound out the word as you change it from mat to fat to sat; from sat to sag to sap; and from sap to sip.

#### Second Grade:

#### <u>Point out the relationship between words</u>

Explain how related words have similar spellings and meanings. Show how a word like knowledge, for example, relates to a word like know.

#### Tell family tales

Children love to hear stories about their family. Talk about a funny thing that happened when you were young.

#### Third Grade:

#### Get them to read another one

Find ways to encourage your child to pick up another book. Introduce him or her to a series like *The Boxcar Children*, *Harry Potter*, or to a second book by a favorite author. Also, ask the librarian for additional suggestions.

#### Expose students to new genres

Read different types of books to expose your child to different types of writing. Some kids prefer nonfiction books or books about things in the world around them.
